

The British Orthopaedic Foot and Ankle Society started out as BOFSS (British Orthopaedic Foot Surgery Society) an informal society, in 1975, under the Presidency of the late Mr Basil Helal and gained its current charitable status in 1980. It has over 750 members including orthopaedic and foot and ankle surgeons and also affiliate members belonging to various allied health professions. BOFAS has grown into one of the larger subspecialist societies of the BOA and considers itself to be a friendly, dynamic and progressively thinking society with the deep-rooted ideals of promoting the study of, research into and propagation of knowledge in foot and ankle surgery. It directs policy and achieves consensus in the treatment of foot and ankle pathology and allied medical issues. It runs a very successful annual scientific meeting annually which includes instructional components for all levels of seniority.

Talks at BOTA congress include: hallux valgus, pes planus, pes cavus, charcot neuropathy, ankle osteoarthritis (replacement vs fusion) and a career in foot & ankle. Plus, we will have 2 workshops on scarf osteotomy and post malleolus ankle fracture fixation.

The aims of the BSSH are to promote and direct the development of Hand Surgery, to foster and co-ordinate education, study and research in Hand Surgery, and to disseminate knowledge of Hand Surgery among members of the medical and allied health professions. The BSSH sponsors scientific meetings and continuing medical educational courses. Its fellowships, bursaries and research grants support research in Hand Surgery and the training of Hand Surgeons. The Society's journal is the Journal of Hand Surgery (European volume). BSSH is a member society of the European Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand (FESSH) and the International Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand (IFSSH).

BOTA congress lectures: scaphoid fractures, carpal dislocations, base of thumb OA, dupuytren's and nerve palsies

Congress workshops: tendon repairs, distal radius (Acu-loc 2) and scaphoid (Acutrak) fixation, metacarpal fixation (Acumed hand plating system) and PIPJ Suzuki frame (k-wires).
